

## From the Church of Scotland, Dunlop

Dear friends and neighbours,

The last Dunlop Diary was issued at the beginning of April, shortly after the beginning of lockdown. Now, as May ends and June begins, we are moving into the first phase of a gradual "unlocking". So much has changed for us over the past couple of months, and the future remains very much uncertain. What we are realising is that what we have taken for granted as "normal" is going to be very different for a long time. This realisation can bring with it a range of responses - from excitement at the opportunity to do things differently to despondency at the loss of the familiar. All our responses are valid - we are all experiencing this situation in our own way and what will be an opportunity for one, will be a challenge for another.

We are going through a huge change in all aspects of how we live our lives, and this change is regularly described as "unprecedented" and for us, it certainly is. But we can look back to the days of the very early church and learn from how the first Christians managed to cope with a huge change in all aspects of their lives. We have St Paul's letters as a guide and we can read how people then had both the excitement and the challenge of working out what their "new normal" would look like. What comes across most powerfully in those letters is that the people are being urged to support and care for each other, to work together and to value each other's contribution, whatever that might be.

I think we are already seeing St Paul's advice being put into action in our own community in this "new normal" of our time. Local businesses and groups are working hard to keep us supplied with essentials (and treats!) and to keep our spirits up. We're doing what we can with technology, and with pictures in windows, and now a community caterpillar! The Gala Day will be very different from usual, and you'll get more information about that.

As in the previous issue of the Diary, we're providing contact details for the various local businesses and groups who're serving our community at this time. We've also provided local authority contacts and details of organisations which can help if you are struggling in any way.

May we all know the blessings of courage and hope as we get through this,
