Dear friends and neighbours,

The last time our Dunlop Diary was issued we were all getting ready for Christmas, so as this is our first Dunlop Diary of 2021, I really should wish you all a very belated Happy New Year!

Our lives have been so disrupted over the past 15 months, that it is sometimes difficult to remember not only what day it is, but sometimes even what month it is! However, as we move into summer some aspects of life are beginning to return to a new kind of normality for many of us. We've all, no matter our age or abilities, had to adopt new ways of doing things - the ways we work, socialise, worship and learn have all changed.

For the past few months it has seemed to me that we are in a similar position to the very first Christians who suddenly found themselves having to work out new ways of being - whether their background was Jew or Gentile, whether they were male or female, whether they were wealthy or poor. No matter their circumstances, they had to negotiate a new and different way of being - one which was shaped by their faith in Jesus Christ, and which was very much about how they related to each other in community. They had to decide what aspects of their previous ways of living could be kept, what needed to be rejected and what new things they should do as Christians.

Right now, as we finally begin to ease our way out of lockdown, it does seem that some of our previous ways of living may not return for a very long time if ever, and on a more positive note, some of the new ways we've adopted since the beginning of the pandemic, are here to stay as they bring something good to our lives and communities.

Sunday worship returned to our church building at Easter and it has been a real joy to hear the bell ringing again on a Sunday morning and to see familiar, albeit masked, faces again in our services. Our on-line services will continue and will soon be streamed live from the church on a Sunday morning, with recordings available to be watched at any time.

Unfortunately, I can't yet provide any news about the Church Hall, but I'm glad that the Village Hall are now providing a chance to get together for coffee/tea and a chat on Tuesday mornings, and I know that plans are underway for the Circle of Friends Alzheimer Group to resume towards the end of the summer. You'll find more information in this issue of the Diary about various groups and activities.

As we continue to find our way through this world which is strangely both familiar and changed, I wish you all God's blessing.
