Dear friends and neighbours,

Our lives continue to be filled with uncertainty and shaped by rules which seem to change constantly. Back in March, when we went into lock-down, and over the summer many of you said to me that you were counting your blessings. These included the blessings of gardens, of open space around us, of good neighbours, of a strong local community, of good weather and of long bright days. As those last two blessings have been replaced with chilly weather and shorter days, it's understandable that many of us are feeling more despondent about the limits placed on our lives. Some aspects of life have returned to some kind of normality, while others remain inaccessible to us. We're not really sure what exactly we are or are not allowed to do, who we can meet up with, and where.

We'll celebrate Harvest on Sunday, 18th October, and you'll be able to donate money to the Harvest House Plant fund at Norman's. We are living in such strange times, all of us, and this time last year we would never have imagined that our lives would have changed so much. If you are finding it overwhelming, don't worry on your own - we are all in this together, and the strangeness and sadness of it is affecting everyone at different times in different ways. Through all of this, God is with us. I find it helps tremendously to take time every day to sit with Him, to speak with Him, to listen to Him, to be calmed, soothed and strengthened by Him.
