Welcome back,

and I hope you all had a pleasant summer, whether you stayed here in Dunlop or ventured further afield for your holidays. Now that the children, and their teachers and other staff, are back at school, all the other groups and organisations which have had a break are starting up again, and village and parish life picks up the pace.

Our Sunday School started back at the end of August, with a full programme of crafts and activities linked to each week's Bible readings. Children and adults alike will be thinking about the same readings each week, and I hope that this will encourage chat and discussion between the generations after church. Over the summer, inspired by the beautiful stained glass windows we have in the church, the children worked with a team of volunteer helpers to create colourful crafts and a "stained glass window" of their own which will be displayed in the church for the next few weeks.

Our lives in faith and in community are very much about coming together to do things, and to share experiences, skills and gifts. All ages come together in church every Sunday morning to do just that in our weekly worship, with time for chat and companionship over a tea or coffee after the service.

From September onwards, there will be another opportunity for worship - a chance to meet less formally to think and talk about what the Bible has to say to us about our daily living, and how that affects the way we respond to the many and varied challenges faced by our world today. These services will differ from our usual Sunday worship in two key respects - we won't be singing, although we may sometimes listen to music, and there will be the chance to talk during the service about the scriptures and how we think about them. Discussion will be very much encouraged, but is not compulsory! These services will last around 20 - 30 minutes, and will include times of listening, silence, speaking, prayer and contemplation. The first of these monthly meetings will take place in the Rear Church Hall at 6.30pm on Wednesday, 6th September. It would be lovely to see you there!

## A GUIDE to the HERALDRY in the Windows of Dunlop Kirk

Last year we were fortunate to have Leslie Hodgson, Dipl. Arch.,FSA Scot, prepare a detailed guide on the Heraldry of Dunlop Kirk's stained glass windows. There are seven heraldic windows (termed 'Armorial Windows' in the Stained Glass Windows booklet) plus another small shield at the very top of the Henderson window.

The guide gives a very informative and detailed description and interpretation of these heraldic windows. It has involved a huge amount of research by Mr Hodgson and we are very grateful to him for providing us with this mine of information.

Copies of the Heraldry Guide will be available in the church on Ayrshire Doors Open Day on Sunday,  $3^{rd}$  September and when the church is open on Sunday afternoons until the end of October from 2-4pm.

# 28th Annual Ayrshire Doors Open Days on 2nd and 3rd September

Throughout September, free access is available to hundreds of fascinating buildings across Scotland. All are of architectural or cultural interest and many are not normally accessible to the generally public. Last year, more than 6,500 people visited the 50 Ayrshire venues open to the public. **Dunlop Kirk** will be participating on **Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> September** from 1-4pm. The church is a 'B' listed building with 27 outstanding stained glass windows to appreciate. Adjacent to the Church are the Clandeboyes Hall and the Hans Hamilton Tomb, both 'A' listed buildings. Tea and coffee will be available and guides will be on hand to show visitors around the church and churchyard.

Everyone is very welcome to join our morning services at 11.30am and the church is also open every Sunday afternoon until the end of October, from 2-4pm.
