As I write this letter, we in the Church are looking forward to Easter, the great Christian celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, God the Son, come to save the world. Everyone is always welcome to join us in worship. I hope also that you will be able to relax and to have some time for yourself this Easter.

We hope to be back in the church by October. The final phase of work is costing about £210,000. We have already spent £15,000 of that in fees, and we have a further £75,000 in the bank, ready to go to this work. We have grants of £33,000 promised, and a further gift promised of £1,000. And so we still need £86,000. If you feel that you would like to help to have the church restored, we will be grateful for any donation you might wish to make. Caldwell and Dunlop Churches Youth Together.

The next meeting is on Sunday, 22^{nd} . April. All young people of Primary 7 age and above are welcome to come along to Caldwell Church, Uplawmoor at 6.30 p.m., for a visit to a local organic farm. Please wear your wellies.

Teen Ranch Weekend.

The young people in the VIK Group and the Youth Together for Dunlop and Caldwell Churches wish to express their thanks for the great effort expended by both congregations which made the fund-raising Coffee Morning a tremendous success.

Teen Ranch is an Outdoor Christian Activity Centre, with an American Western theme, in Inchture, Perthshire. We leave on Friday, 4th. May, and return on Sunday, 6th. May. We plan to take part in activities such as canoeing, horse riding, and numerous other outdoor pursuits, as well as taking new and exciting time out for worship. Five adult leaders will be taking sixteen young people from Dunlop and Caldwell to this weekend, and we hope to be with other youth groups at the ranch.

The church and Presbytery support of the youth group has been very encouraging to the leaders and young people, and has increased for all of us the sense of our together being the church family. Thank you.

Last year work was completed on the first phase of restoration of the church. These works allowed the long term future of the structure and external fabric of the building to be secured, but those who have had the opportunity to see inside the church during the last six months will be aware that there is still much to do to complete the restoration.

The focus of the next phase is to bring the church back into active use by reinstating the interior and upgrading it to the requirements of modern worship. Plans for this work are now well advanced, and with all necessary approvals obtained, contractors will be invited to tender for the work within the next two months. The main elements included in Phase 2 are: new toilets in the former vestry area; the creation of a small servery area to allow tea and coffee to be served after a service; the reinstatement of all wall linings, doors, etc.; the completion of repairs to the ceiling; and new lighting, and audio visual facilities. Once all that is completed the interior has to be decorated, new carpet has to be laid and new chairs put into place.

The approach taken in remodelling the interior has been to sensitively adapt the ground floor area to create a more flexible space with individual seating rather than the pews, while leaving the three upstairs galleries largely untouched. Care has been taken to respect the historic character of the building and to ensure that the significant features such as the stained glass and the pulpit are complemented by the new interior scheme.

Subject to the necessary funding being obtained it is hoped to have the building re-opened for worship by October.
