

During the winter of 1952, British authorities entered the home of mathematician, cryptanalyst and war hero Alan Turing (Benedict Cumberbatch - Sherlock, The Hobbit) to investigate a reported burglary. They instead ended up arresting Turing himself on charges of 'gross indecency', an accusation that would lead to his devastating conviction for the criminal offence of homosexuality - little did officials know, they were actually incriminating the pioneer of modern-day computing. Famously leading a motley group of scholars, linguists, chess champions and intelligence officers, he was credited with cracking the socalled unbreakable codes of Germany's World War II Enigma machine. An intense and haunting portrayal of a brilliant, complicated man, THE IMITATION GAME follows a genius who under nail-biting pressure helped to shorten the war and, in turn, save thousands of lives.

Use of Bins Outside Village Hall

Some clarification of the use of the bins outside the village hall seems to be required.

The black bins for plastic, cans and glass are provided by East Ayrshire for the use of the community.

The green bin for food waste and blue bins for general waste and paper/cardboard are for the use of the village hall only. The Community Company is charged for getting these emptied. They are not for general community use.

There have been occasions when the bins have been filled by members of the public leaving no room for users of the Hall to dispose of waste.

Getting these bins emptied more regularly than would be required by Hall use only is an added expense that the Community Company can do without.

Your cooperation in using the bins properly would be much appreciated. There is a facility for recycling paper and cardboard in Sainsbury's car park in Stewarton should you need it.
