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At our morning Holy Communion service on the last Sunday in April, I was incredibly moved that the elders who joined me at the communion table were all women. A first for me, and a first for Dunlop! Adding to the emotion, and sense of rightness, of the moment was the slogan on the top worn by one of the youngest present, which spelled out in sequins - "Girls can do anything"

This year the Church of Scotland celebrates the 50th anniversary of the decision of the General Assembly on 22nd May 1968 that women may be ordained as Ministers of Word and Sacrament. This came 2 years after it was decided that women may be ordained as elders. Despite official acceptance and approval, progress has been slow and in a few areas of Scotland, there has been no change at all in the past 52 years. Recent publicity of continuing and deeply ingrained sex discrimination in the secular world shows that this is a problem not restricted to the church.

Women of all ages and abilities make significant contributions in both church and civic life, in both public and domestic spheres. Legal changes to uphold the rights of women and promote equality between the sexes can only take us so far. We, as individuals, communities and congregations, need also to challenge sexism and discrimination when we see it, and to do as much as we can to make sure that the gifts, abilities and dignity of girls and women are recognised and celebrated.

As St Paul said in his Letter to the Galatians, "There is no longer ... male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus."

Or, as expressed in sequins, "Girls can do anything!"

YOUNG PEOPLE - In 5 years time there is likely to be over 150 teenagers living in Dunlop.

The community needs to plan ahead to provide facilities and activities for all these young people.

THE SCHOOL - Plans are being prepared to spend over £2m extending Dunlop Primary School.

This investment is great for the village, but what are the implications for village life both during construction and once the extension is complete?

RAISING FUNDS - Dunlop has great community facilities, but investment is needed in the Village Hall, Merito, the Church Hall, the playing field, the Bowling Club....

How is the community going to raise the necessary funds to maintain and develop these facilities, especially if all are competing for the same limited pot of grant money?

ROAD SAFETY - In recent months there have been minor road accidents and near misses in the village.

The community needs to consider radical solutions to deal with irresponsible parking, speeding traffic, heavy vehicles and poor road conditions.
